Which we respected, never pushed, and trusted that God would work in his own way.

Over the years, Holly and Chiara would have some sporadic spiritual conversations, but never anything that made her think that Chiara was seriously thinking about her faith. But slowly, over time, Chiara started asking Holly to pray for her (which she was of course already doing). When her dog got sick, she told Holly she tried praying for her. When she began asking more questions, Holly gave her a Jesus Calling book. But still, true faith seemed a long way

Until it wasn't anymore. We all come to our faith in different ways. For Chiara, it came as a sort of rush all of a sudden when she was thinking through everything she had heard

and read from Holly, Tamika and others. As she put it, it was like a sudden realization: "I believe. I believe all of it."

She called Holly in an almost panic and rushed to tell her good friend of almost 6 years what we had been praying for for almost as long: she believed in Jesus Christ and wanted to be baptized.

It was almost like whiplash for us. We knew there had been interest there, but not this much interest. We knew that God had been working in the background, but not to this extent. We were able to witness firsthand that God works in his own way for everyone.

So Chiara was baptized as a sister in Christ one rainy evening last month. Since then, she has been a whirlwind of faith, integrating seamlessly into our church, getting to know everyone, even inviting her own people to the Donau Gemeinde Christi. She is a testament to the concept of planting seeds, and trusting in God to make them grow.
